Monroe Shag Club Gives Back

When my husband and I joined the Monroe Shag Club in 1998, we heard various members talking about "Shaggin' for Dollars". With no background information, we were not sure what was being discussed, but it sounded intriguing. It seems that the Monroe Shag Club not only wants to have a good time, meet new friends, listen to beach music and dance, but they also want to give back to the community.

This little club of 100 people has raised over \$200,000 in the past 7 years to give to various charities in Union County. Some of the past recipients have been Special Olympics, Hospice, and Turning Point. This year's recipients will be HealthQuest and the Veterans Council.

HealthQuest is a non-profit organization that provides medications to people who cannot otherwise afford them. It is a sad thing when our neighbors have to choose between food and medicine. With HealthQuest, they no longer have to make that choice. HealthQuest is able to turn \$1.00 of contributions into \$12.28 worth of medications for clients.

The Veterans Council is a non-profit organization that is designed to help our Veterans or current military personnel with items that cannot be covered elsewhere. This particular event will serve to help a family whose father is currently serving in Iraq. His first child was born prematurely and has significant problems with her skull. The medical insurance from the government considers any procedures to be cosmetic and have denied coverage. Numerous physicians have stated this child needs significant medical attention now to allow jaw alignment, properly performing sinuses and to appear as a normal child. The family has maxxed out their credit cards for medical expenses at a 22% interest rate. This Sergeant needs to be focusing on his job in Iraq, not worrying about his baby girl and her future. The Monroe Shag Club wants to help put his mind at ease.

It is amazing to watch our club members put this event together. You have to organize various committees such as decorating, silent auction committee, publicity, finance, ticket sales, hospitality, 50/50 and of course, entertainment. The first item on the agenda each

year is to choose the charities. Numerous charities submit an application to the Monroe Shag Club Foundation which is a non-profit organization. The Foundation Board then selects the recipients for the year.

Once this is done, the Chairperson for the event gets started with a theme and then it is off to the races! Each club member is asked to sell tickets, ask for silent auction donations and donations for our charities. The night of the event, different members dance and the audience is asked to throw money on the floor, hence the name "Shaggin' for Dollars". Over time, our dancers have spread their wings and we not only have Shaggin' for Dollars, but we have two-stepping for dollars, cha-cha for dollars, jiving for dollars, etc. We are not proud, whatever type of dance (within the bounds of decency) can get our audience to throw money on the floor can be done.

Each year, we also have special entertainment. Our DJ's, Ray Scott and Gene Sistare, provide some interesting entertainment at the start of the event. We certainly count on the two of them to keep the event going that night! If you have ever heard Ray and Gene, you know they are fabulous. When you put the two of them together you get "Double the Fun and Double the Pleasure".

Our club is also lucky to have some very artistic people who put forth a great effort to make our entertainment great. We have had Elvis, the Sweet Inspirations, Jerry Lewis, Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin and various other celebrities join us the night of the event.

This year, our theme is Puttin' on the Ritz. The event will be held at the Rolling Hills Country Club in Monroe, North Carolina on Saturday, August 4th at 7:00 pm. I believe some people join a club and just come to the social functions. Others join a club and participate in all their activities. I believe these people get more pleasure from their membership. How Two Californians Became South Carolinians

We are always asked what brought us all the way from the left coast to the "right" coast. In a word "SHAG." When we tell people that the dance is what brought us here, we sometimes see a look of disbelief on their faces.

Dancing has always been a part of our lives. Don and I met at Country-Western dance lessons almost 25 years ago - summer of 1982. We married in March of 1983 and shortly after that we joined a dance team "Steppin' Country." The team participated in competitions as well as performed at street fairs, county fairs and miscellaneous other events. We also competed as a couple.

The first years of our marriage were very busy. For 12 years we taught C/W dance several nights each week. We started a social dance club, "Luv'n Country," and we were the DJs for the club's monthly dances. Then we began to DJ weddings, birthdays, class reunions, etc., etc., etc. We both had full-time jobs (and four children) so all of this fun stuff was in our "spare" time.

Our interest in this great dance, the SHAG, started back in 1999. As a lot of you know, the group, Alabama, had a song called "Dancing and Shagging On The Boulevard." We happened to see the video (which was filmed at Peaches Corner and around the Myrtle Beach OD area) and thought the dance looked like fun. Neither of us had been to the east coast so in June of 1999 we visited Myrtle Beach for the first time. Through Linda "T", a DJ friend of ours, we learned of Charlie and Jackie's teaching videos so we were able to learn the basics before our trip. We were here for just four days and during that time we took a private lesson from Sandra Schwartz, found out about SOS and just happened to buy a timeshare. That sealed our fate. For the next 4 years we attended just Spring Safari. We would come to SOS for 10 days, taking a lot of lessons, and by the end of the event we were dancing pretty good. Then we would fly back to California, not dance for a year and come back to the next SOS and have to learn all over again. In 2004 and 2005 we came to both Spring Safari and Fall Migration.

We enjoyed the area and all of the nice people we met and could see that the "Shag" wasn't just a dance, it was a lifestyle. From our first SOS Don started saying he could see us living here. Even though I enjoyed our vacations here, I wasn't ready to quit a good job with good benefits and start over. I also wasn't ready to leave the family behind. But, that changed after Don had to go through cancer treatments in 2003 and at same time he lost his 32-year-old son to cancer. The saying "life is short and you aren't promised tomorrow" took on a new meaning. So while attending Fall Migration in 2005 we put a deposit on a house in Little River, went back to CA and put our house on the market and I gave my notice at work. I retired April 1, 2006 and on May 10 we started our drive across country to our new home. Arrived May 17, 2006 and feel this is where we belong.

We have met a lot of wonderful people through the dance classes (and just hangin' out) and they have all made us feel very welcome. We look forward to many, many years of shaggin' the night away.

HELP! CALL 911!

SOS purchased Defibrillators for all of the SOS clubs in case anyone should suffer an emergency from heart attack, or stop breathing for any reason.

An AED (Automated Electronic Defibrillator) Training Certification was conducted at the Ocean Drive Resort. The two instructors were from Saint Ropers Hospital in Charleston, South Carolina. We had fourteen staff members from the SOS clubs participating in the training sessions. We were divided into three groups with three persons working in each group. Each trainee had to perform all of the facets of CPR, attaching and operating the defibrillator on the victim. It was a very interesting, intense four hour course. Fat Harold's Beach Club had already certified seventeen people through his certification training for the AED that he had purchased. This gives SOS thirty one trained (certified) technicians to work with the AED in case of emergencies that might occur in the SOS clubs. Ducks, Fat Harold's, OD Arcade, and OD Resort has AED's.



The instructional portion of the training taught the proper methods of calling for help, secure the area as safe,

checking for signs of breathing, and performing CPR. Practicing on a manikin (dummy) following along with the VCR guidance tape is interesting and informative. It taught us that if you find someone in distress (conscious or unconscious) to determine that the person is in a safe area (out of danger), yell for help, send someone to get an AED if available, and call 911. Once that is done, you check the victims breathing. If the victim is not breathing, tilt the head back, lift the chin to open the airway, pinch the nose and cover the mouth with your mouth. (In the AED case, there is a plastic mask that covers the victim's nose and mouth.

Insert the tube into the face mask. Make sure that you have a good seal around the nose/mouth. Give two short puffs of air into the victim's mouth, and watch for chest rise when puffing into the victim. After the two puffs, place the heel of one hand onto an imaginary line between the victim's nipples, interlock the fingers of the other hand or place the heel of your other hand on top of the hand on the



chest and do thirty (30) chest compressions. Count along with the compressions for rhythm Return to the mouth and give two (2) short puffs, watch for the chest rise, immediately begin another thirty chest compressions. You must continue this progression until help arrives. As soon as a defibrillator is available, open the case, turn the unit on, remove the pads in the case and place on the victim's chest area. The pads show a picture where to place. Peel the backing off of the pad and attach in the proper area as directed. Once the AED is connected to the victim, it will diagnose if there is a heart beat. If no heart beat is found the machine will charge and announce to stand clear of the victim. When the victim is clear the machine has instructed you to initiate the shock. After the shock,



the AED will diagnose the victim for a heart beat and will instruct you to either shock or start CPR (2 puffs/30 chest compressions). This is done for a period of two minutes;

the machine is monitoring the victim's response to the CPR. Continue the CPR until help has arrived (EMT) or until the victim is conscience and breathing on their own.

The importance of the two puffs and thirty compressions are putting oxygen into the blood stream and circulating the blood by massaging the heart. You must continue this repetition until trained help arrives (EMT). One day you may find that you are in a position to help save someone's life. If so, I hope this information will come flooding into your racing mind, and you can help someone. If you ever have the opportunity to take a CPR class, I encourage you to do so. It can make a difference for someone.

Who We Are!

What is SOS? It is the initials of an organization called Society of Stranders. This name described a group of young people (lifeguards, waitresses, bingo callers, bus boys, etc.) who worked their summers on the beaches in Ocean Drive, Cherry Grove, Windy Hill, Crescent Beach, and Myrtle Beach. A reunion of these first beach workers, in September, 1980, to renew the old friendships, became the first SOS. Many came to that first gathering in September 1980, and thus became The Society of Stranders, a.k.a. SOS.

Today, SOS is a group of friends that has become like family, to share the lifestyle of shag dancing and its music. We are dedicated to this lifestyle. Shag is a lifestyle that is embraced by this community. The early shaggers came from the 1950's and 1960's. The base of our community today is made of old jitterbugs, shaggers, lovers of beach music, empty nesters in their late thirties, early forties, fifty, sixties, and anyone else that has stumbled onto our dance. Once you have witnessed a shag contest, or lucky enough to attend an SOS event, you will become enthralled with the music and the dance. Once you have experienced the camaraderie of this great lifestyle, you will become smitten. It will become the social focus of your life. So be for-warned, once in the blood, you will never be able to deny this wonderful lifestyle with all that it has to offer.

What We Are!

We are an organization of dancers that enjoy the shag dance and the lifestyle that goes along with the dance events. Our members are members of local shag clubs that make up the Association of Carolina Shag Clubs, the owner of SOS, and many thousands of others that have witnessed the dance and the lifestyle during our many events around the southeast. Our SOS events are in North Myrtle Beach, SC. We have three events each year. The first is Mid Winter, and is held in January each year. Spring Safari is held in April, and the Fall Migration is held in the middle of September. Spring Safari and Fall Migration are ten days event's, Mid Winter is a four day event. The highlight of Spring Safari is our Shag Club Parade the last Saturday of Safari. Fun Sunday and Fun Monday are street parties, and are the highlight of Fall Migration.

In addition to these events, we have two workshops, the Winter Workshop is the last weekend in February, and the Summer Workshop is the second weekend in July. These Workshops are held in various cities of one of the hosting Shag clubs in the ACSC.

What We Do

The SOS events are becoming legendary, but this organization is not only about fun and dancing, although that is our main focus. We have established ourselves to be good citizens to the city of North Myrtle Beach. When we host our SOS events, we bring 15,000 people to the NMB area for ten days. That equates to an impact on the city of NMB in the amount of \$7-8 million dollars spent in the surrounding area for the 10 days. In addition, many of our members are, or have become homeowners and tax payers in this community.

We have provided equipment to the NMB Public Safety Department, to help serve their community. We appreciate the

commitment of the City of NMB to our membership, and SOS looks forward to a continuing relationship with the city.

We share a partnership with the Beach Clubs in NMB to host our events. This partnership is most beneficial to the shag world. This is the heartbeat of shag, our "garden of dance in the sun" here on the coast of South Carolina.

Accomplishments

- A \$10,000 donation to one of our partner's grandson's cancer treatment
- ACSC and SOS established a \$100,000.00 grant to Hospice that assist Hospice in their work in helping those with cancer.
- A \$10,000 donation in honor to our Florida clubs to help with the devastation of Hurricane Andrew in south Florida
- A \$10,000 donation to the Governors Relief Fund of North Carolina in honor of our North Carolina Shag Clubs after a Hurricane flooded the state.
- A \$10,000 expenditure toward equipment donated, and service to the City of North Myrtle Beach Public Safety.
- A \$5000 contribution and underwriting of expenses to the Hall of Fame Foundation
- A \$25,000 Award to the University of South Carolina's school of dance to establish a scholarship in the name of Phd. Phil Sawyer. The recipient of the scholarship will teach our state dance, the shag, to others in surrounding schools and in the University system.
- SOS participated in a community effort to raising \$28,000 dedicated to the relief and assistance of the New York Fire Department after September 11th, 2001.

Various Other Donations...

Fat Harold's Camp Kemo Auction has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for kids with cancer to attend a week of camp each summer.

The 100 shag clubs that make up the ACSC has raised and donated monies to various local and national charities that total into a hundred thousand dollars, plus.

We stay busy, we work hard, and we have fun. Come dance with us!

“COME BACK CLUB”

Tucked away in the rolling hills of the Blue Ridge Mountains and at the mouth of the Linville Gorge is Lake James, a 6510-acre lake with more than 150 miles of shoreline. It is bordered by Burke and McDowell Counties. Lake James for many years and to the present day is a pristine lake offering great beaches where the local residents and visitors enjoy swimming, sunbathing, boating, fishing and other water activities.

Located on the shoreline of Lakes James in years gone by was a place where locals gathered to enjoy a day of fun. The place came to be known as Sandy Beach. There was a particular group of locals, namely William Honeycutt, Deanes Short, Alan Parks, Jan Norvell, Jean Powell, Debbie Short, Ken Michaels, Alan Brown, Tommy Biggerstaff, Bob Ledford and others who at the time enjoyed the lake and shared a common interest of shag dancing. By the efforts of these individuals and others, the Sandy Beach Shag Club was formed in Morganton, NC.

During the following years the SBSC continued to grow with a membership exceeding 400. The Club became very active, promoted shag lessons, special dances and fellowship. The SBSC joined the ACSC and was active members in attending events sponsored by SOS.

Then in 2000, the SBSC for reasons known and unknown disbanded and remained such until May of 2005 when again some of the original members reformed the club.

SBSC is now in its third year on the come back trail and is enjoying a membership of 117. The club is again in good standing with the ACSC and several of its members are always in attendance at SOS functions. The club, with the election of its new officers this month, has established for the first time a Saturday night dance, host special dances, continues to conduct shag lessons and Sunday afternoons parties at the Boardwalk Grill by the River in Morganton.

All members of the club are very supportive and appreciated. Visitors always find a friendly face and great fellowship. The club has become known throughout the area and dances at the Elks Lodge in Morganton, NC.

Let it never be said that a shag club is no more.... the Sandy Beach Shag Club is a come back club which continues to support and preserve the heritage of beach and shag music always being devoted to shag dancing.

HALL OF FAME**

The Shaggers Hall of Fame was started in 1983, and since that time there have been approximately 200 of our friends nominated and voted in as Hall of Fame Inductees. Each year there are (4) female and (4) male inductees, and there has also been Honorary, Charlie Boone Memorial, and Posthumous members. The qualifications for consideration into the Shaggers Hall of Fame are (1) a good dancer, (2) Support of the Dance, (3) Love of the Dance, (4) Support of the Hall of Fame by participating in Shag Attack and other Shag events, (5) is nominated and will have turned 50 by the time of their induction.

I had the privilege of attending the meeting for nominating future inductees and voting in new members that was held March 17, 2007, at the OD Resort. Having been honored by being a 1992 inductee, I was asked to attend the meeting to observe and write this article to explain the induction process. It took approximately four hours to vote on the 2007 inductees and determine the future nominees.

Present at the meeting were Chick Hedrick, CEO; Sam McIntosh, President; the three executive board members, the six board members, the six members of the selection committee and the 2006 inductees.

The members who are allowed to vote are two board members serving three years alternately, and the 2006 inductees. These are also the people who can nominate one male and one female or they can pass on nominating. Everyone had the chance to discuss who they nominated or someone that had already been nominated in the past and everyone was very respectful of what was said about the people they were supporting. There were no negative comments about any person. As a matter of fact, there were many, many compliments from their peers. After voting is completed the votes are turned over to the Executive Committee for count and put in a sealed envelope. No other person in the room knew who was inducted until it was announced that night.

As Sam McIntosh quoted, "What happens here stays here"!



The Inductees were announced Saturday night around 9:00 PM. I took photos of all the inductees and they were some very surprised and happy expressions...lots of smiles and happy tears. It still amazes me what support and love comes from friends and family that night. After all inductees are announced everybody hits the floor with congratulations and lots of hugs!!!

The 2007 Hall of Fame inductee's photos and bios will be framed and displayed in the OD Resort where all the previous inductees are now displayed. Please make it a point to visit the Hall of Fame to view and read about the inductees...some great stories and history of how they got involved with the music and dance. The 2007 Induction Ceremony will be held at the OD Resort on October 13, 2007.

In a similar process the Hall of Fame promotes the "Keepers of the Dance" inductees, who are former junior shaggers and their framed information is housed in Ducks Beach Club. This organization began in 1998, as a part of the Hall of Fame, and now has twenty-two inductees. The 2007 inductees, Grayson Smith and Dana Brown Barton, were also announced Saturday night. The criteria for the "Keepers" are (1) having been a junior shagger, (2) at least 25 years old, (3) continues to support and keep the dance alive. The board consists of Bob Myrick, Kathryn Tilghman, Bill Barber, Susan Neal, Barry Thigpen, Sam McIntosh, Chick Hedrick, Norfleet Jones, and Leslie Williamson as Adviser.

2008 will be the 25th Anniversary of the "Shaggers Hall of Fame" and the 10th Anniversary of the "Keepers of the Dance". These organizations keep the music and dance alive for us.
