Music for the weekend was provided by Hall of Fame members; Bill Harper, Eddie Smith and Bill Moore. The Hall of Fame ceremony began at 9 on Saturday evening with MC Mr. John Moore. DJ Hall of Fame Mr. Eddie Smith provided some great beach music. "MEMORIES LIVE FOREVER" is a candlelight ceremony that began with a special tribute for those Hall of Fame members that have passed away since our last reunion. A candle is lit when the name of each departed member is read aloud with the song being played "Angles Flying to Close to the Ground" by Jerry Butler. This is a very special memorial and emotional to a lot of people in attendance.

The Inductees for 2012: O'Neal Bourne, North Myrtle Beach; Nikki Galantis, Morehead City; Patricia Lyons, New Bern; Jean Bryland, Raleigh; Tom Saieed, Wilson; Joe Bland, Tarboro; J.T. Price, Winterville; Rusty Cutshaw, Atlantic Beach received an honorary award and Ray Hollowell, Morehead (deceased) received a posthumous award.

Also each year Atlantic Beach Shaggers Hall of Fame Board along with Memories Beach Club's Board selects a person or person's to receive the "Spirit of the Dance Award". This award is presented this year to Susie Griffin from Beulaville and Fred Davis, Beaufort. This award is presented to Susie and Fred for their outstanding love of the dance for their teaching and sharing the dance and support of the Shag tradition. The same committees select a person or person's to receive the "Life Time Achievement award". The award this year went to Alan Hilbert, Morehead City and Tommy "T-Bird" Smith, New Bern. This award is presented this year for their 30 some years in the Radio, Video or DJ work. For their contribution to Shag Clubs and Association of Beach and Shag Club Disk Jockey's and other organizations relative to the music and lifestyle of the dance. All of these awards presented to the recipients have devoted their life to the music and dance. The Atlantic Beach Shaggers Hall of Fame, Inc and Memories Beach Club, LLC is honored and proud to recognizing these deserving people.

This awards ceremony takes place the last weekend of February of each year at MEMORIES Beach Club, Atlantic Beach, N.C. This was one of the biggest Hall of Fame to date; attended by some 275 plus shaggers. The owners of Memories take great pride in this ceremony as we start our 15 year of great beach music and the dance know as "THE SHAG".

knew he had to leave and kept on going. We all remember Thomas Wolfe's legacy to wisdom in this world—"You can't go home again."

At that time, there was no assurance that there would ever be another S.O.S. North Myrtle Beach didn't know quite what to make of us; there was mixed emotion. Some said move it to Myrtle. Swink knew this would not work. But the shaggers and stranders were united in one thought—we're gonna do it again next year.

Thus began the Fall Migration. It did not have a name at the time—that came later—and fortunately for all of us today, there was another S.O.S. in September 1981.

All of us owe Swink Laughter. What he begat has become something we must have, our events at the beach. There are none others like it. S.O.S. stands above and beyond any and all parties for true lovers of beach, beach music,

shaggers, boppers, stranders, and swingers anywhere in the country.

S.O.S. has grown with the times. We are now a ten-day festival, and throughout this *Carefree Times* you can read about the many exciting things that will be yours this week.

But as you marvel at the incredibly lucky breaks that caused you to be a part of it, pause for a moment. Walk out to the beach, look out at the ocean, turn your head to capture the pulsating beat of beach music from the nearest deejay, look up to the azure Carolina sky, and think to yourself: Thank you, Lord.!

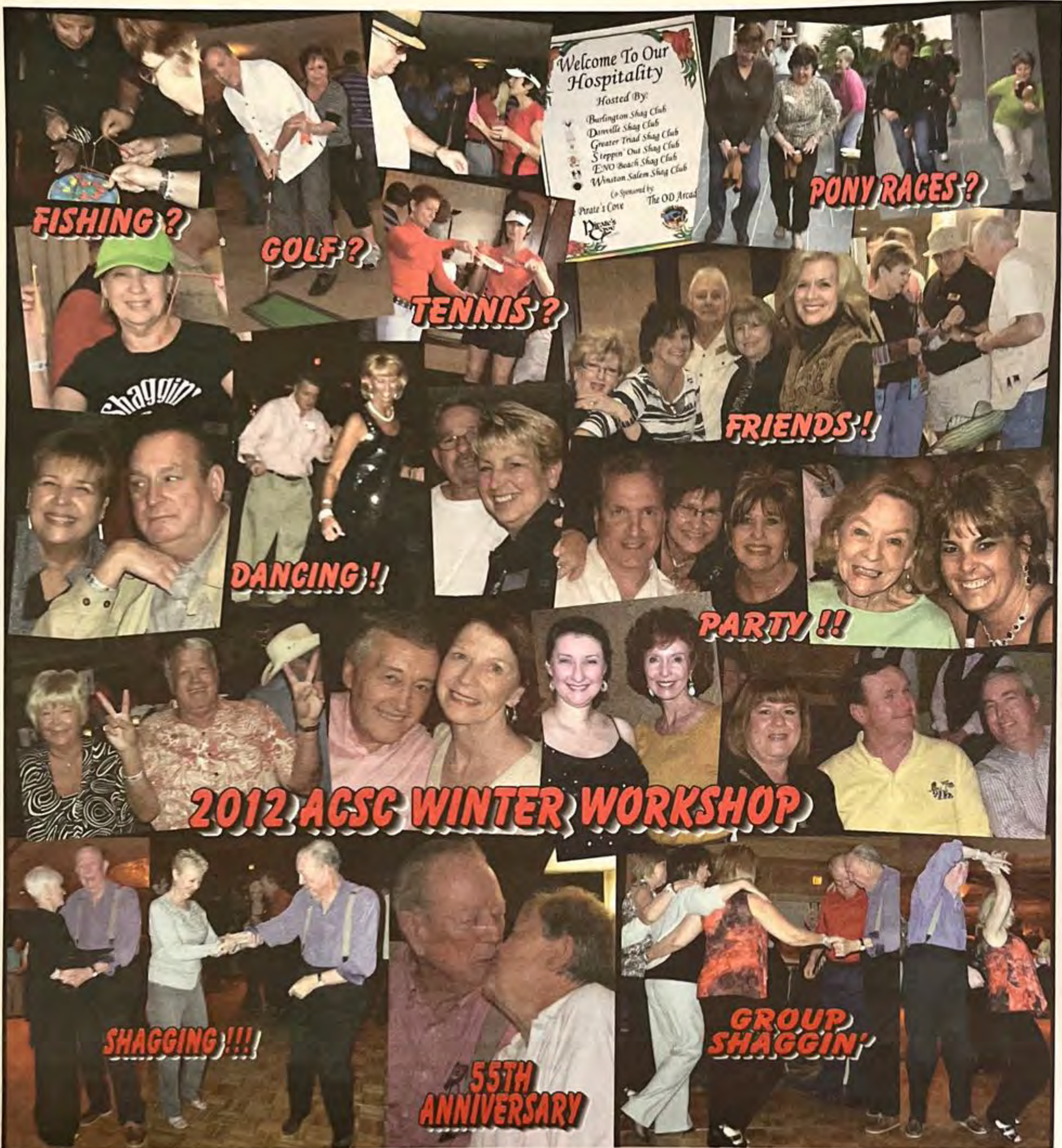

Beth Mitchell Memorial - Charity Mixed Doubles

The Beth Mitchell contest began in 2004 at Thirsty's 2 in Greensboro. This event developed from an idea Beth's parents, Nancy and Worth, had as a way to keep her memory alive. They had already set up a scholarship in her name to help someone associated with the shag community to continue their college education. Thus far, there have been eleven students who have been beneficiaries of the Beth Mitchell scholarship fund.

Beth was born in Greensboro in 1972 but grew up in Stoneville. After graduating from UNCG, she became an elementary teacher although her true love was dancing. From her early years, she began winning contests as a junior shagger, in Atlantic Beach, Ocean Drive and in Greensboro. In early March of 1998, Beth and her partner, Brad Kinard, won the Non-Pro National Shag Championship. Tragically, on March 20, Beth lost her life in a tornado that demolished the town of Stoneville.

This year, Thirsty's 2 held the 9th annual Beth Mitchell mixed doubles contest on February 4, 2012. The one night event had an outstanding show of dancers competing in three divisions. There were a total of 20 couples dancing in the Junior, Non-Pro and Pro/Hall of Fame divisions. The winners were: Juniors: Sydney West & Kyler Byrum; Non-Pro: Robin Powell & Andy Hill; Pro/Hall of Famers: Leslie Melton & Brad Kinard. Along with the many sponsors and fundraisers, the contest donated \$2,850 to the Beth Mitchell scholarship fund – another great year!

DJ Hall of Fame 2012 Inductees

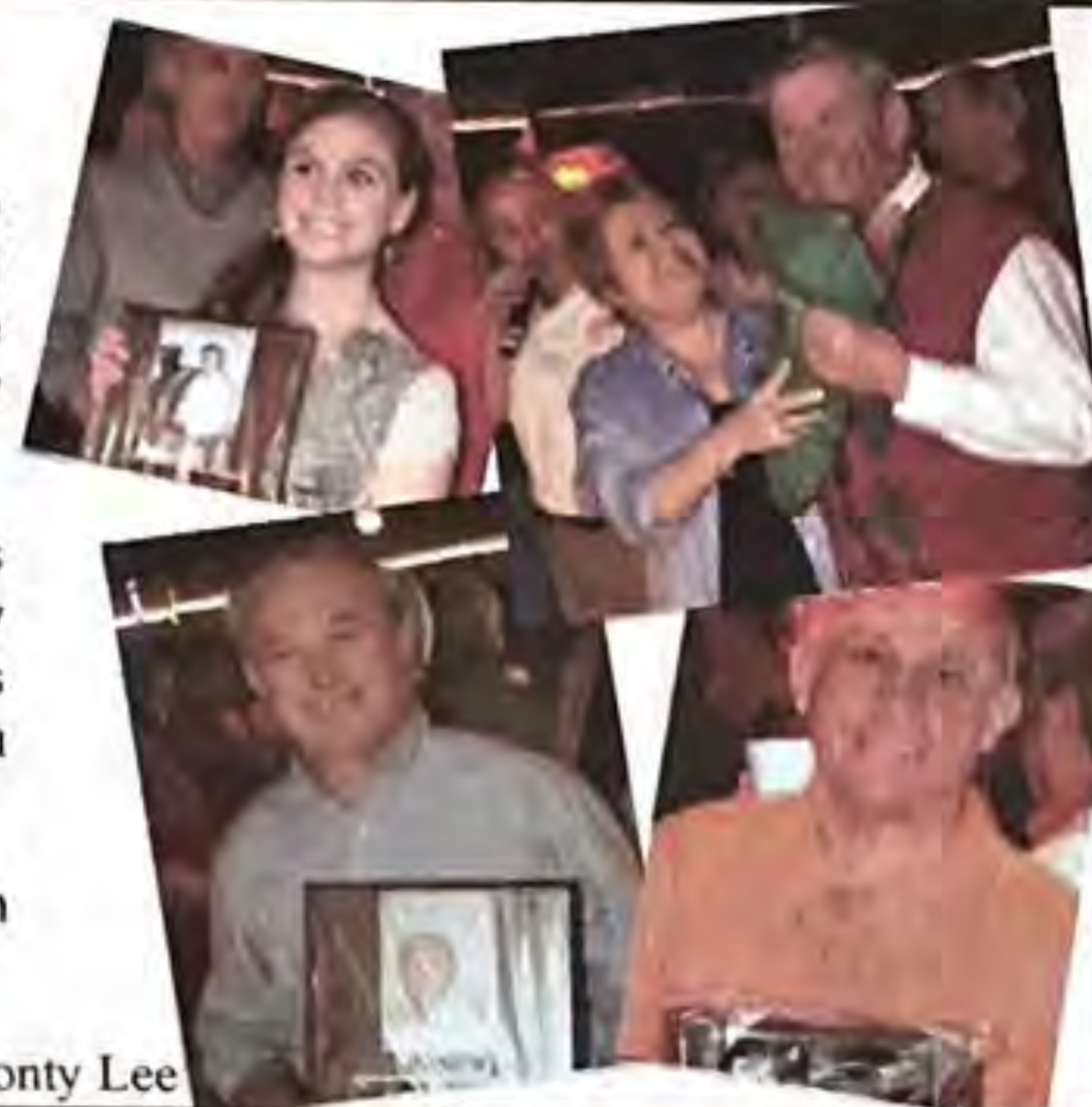

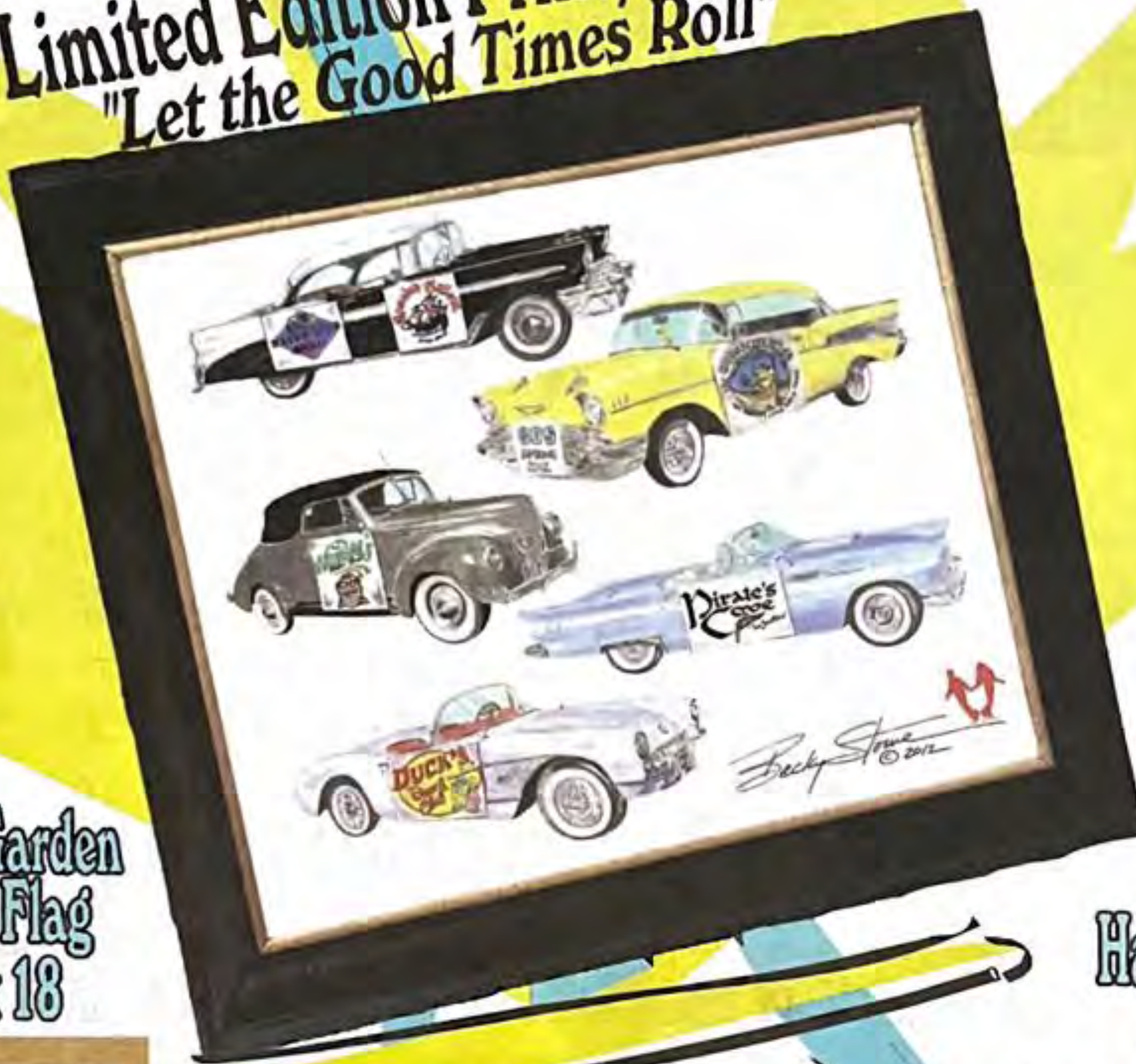

As you drive through North Myrtle Beach, you see the colorful street signs designating the specific communities—Cherry Grove, Ocean Drive, Crescent Beach, and Windy Hill. If this is your first visit to North Myrtle Beach, you may not know the rich history of the area. And, if this is your 21st visit, you may not know the origin of the beach communities and how each received its distinctive name. Check out the “Toponymy” sidebar for a little history lesson!

This is an exciting time in the life of our community.

The North Myrtle Beach area has a significant history that began more than 10,000 years ago when Native Americans lived off the bounties of the environment.

We continue to enjoy the area as we dance, sun, vacation, and visit with our friends.

North Myrtle Beach Area Historical Museum, scheduled to open in 2012, is dedicated to preserving everything that is remarkable about the region. The Museum will share stories of families and fishing, churches and children, sports and schools, doctors and dancing, birthdays and barbecues—seasonal, year-round, and daily events that reveal the breadth of life in our community.

You can be a Founding Member of the Museum.

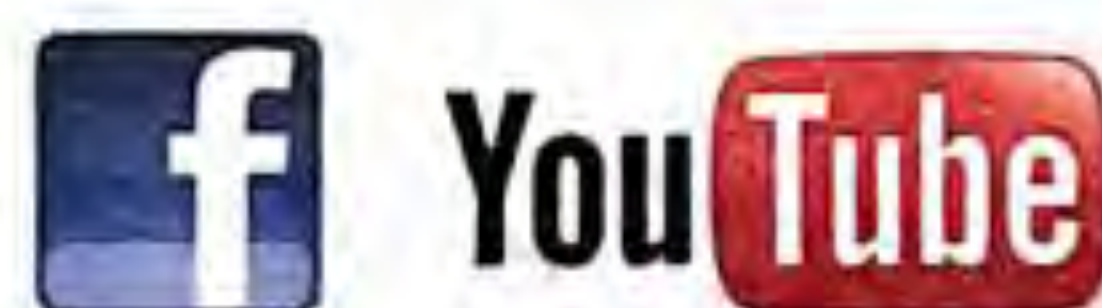
You can be a Founding Member only once. When the Museum opens, only the names of those who envisioned the Museum will be included on the Founder's Wall. As a Founding Member:

Toponymy: the study of place-names, based on historical and geographical information.

A place-name is a word or words used to indicate, denote, or identify a geographic locality such as a town, river, or mountain. Toponymy divides place-names into two broad categories: habitation names and feature names.

Northeastern South Carolina has several communities named for geographic features. Landscape toponyms or place names refer to natural or physical features of the site and are subdivided into three categories:

- **ORONYMS** or relief features - Ocean Drive, Crescent Beach, and Windy Hill;
- **HYDRONYMS** or water features - Little River and Atlantic Beach;
- **PLACES** of natural vegetation growth - Cherry Grove and Myrtle Beach.

A Book About Us

He sifted through stacked boxes packed full of old beach and shag publications he has collected over a span of six decades and counting. They held pages upon pages of articles about the fun emanating from carefree times enjoyed by beach lovers, hailed as "beach bums," which most of us will never experience but can only dream about; the music flowing from coin-operated jukeboxes that energized the haunts they haunted; and the dance cultivating from infusion of all the creative outlets harboring their impulses to life, as they saw it, in "paradise." Many of the articles he, himself, had written. They were a treasure trove of personal keepsakes he speculated held no value to anyone else but him. Sporadic as they were to thumb through and pinpoint particular topics, he halfheartedly figured most folks just weren't overly interested in the history their pages held. As he plowed through each box, twinkles of fond memories began to flash by. He could almost feel the ocean breeze, hear the buzzing juke boxes, taste the cold beer, smell the sultry perfume, and see the flashy dancers. He thought, "These were damn good times that should never be forgotten. These beach bums were pioneers pushing the frontier of shag into an art form, and having a helluva good time doing it too."

With twenty-twenty hindsight and the restful relaxation of knowing perfectly well the balance of outcomes, he once again leisurely skimmed through each publication revisiting an intriguing past and occasionally fast-forwarding to the present. As he slowly drifted his index finger across the words on each page, he began connecting the dots in a way he had never before thought of doing. Events seemed frozen in time, but when his thought pattern began placing them chronologically, the hands on the clock seemed to move again. He began to clearly envision how all of the music, dance, beach bums and other interwoven threads that had drifted ashore, or thumbed a ride to the beach at Ocean Drive met, stirred and meshed into the subculture we know today as the Society of Stranders (SOS). All of a sudden a light turned on in his head; he instantly knew that this would make a damn good story. The contents of these articles needed to be joined together into a book that tells the story about us, the Society of Stranders.

SOS is an organization he, Dr. Phil Sawyer (the real Dr. Phil), SOS President Emeritus and shag historian, has been a part of since its spontaneous beginnings. It holds a very dear and special place in his heart that beats with the infectious pulse of rhythm and blues majestically flowing with the ocean breeze out onto the dance floors and into the souls of those who faithfully migrate to its Mid-Winter

Classic, Spring Safari and Fall Migration. SOS is a paramour he lusts for with a blind lover's unquestioned passion; an insatiable thirst that is unquenchable. It was his ship to navigate for many years; and navigate it through rough seas into safe waters, he did.

Dr. Phil gathered up a representative sample of these articles, organized them into a saddlebag-like satchel, hooked up his suspenders, and galloped off to a meeting he had arranged with Linda Fogle, assistant executive director of the University of South Carolina (USC) Press. He aimed to present his idea and obtain feedback as to whether it held merit to pen into a book; and if so, he would ask for a recommendation on a professional writer to co-write the book with him. Although he is wonderfully blessed with magnificent writing skills, he felt his struggle with Parkinson Disease would hinder his ability to alone put words to paper. He also wanted a fresh outlook from a talented writer who was an outsider, so to speak, to the shag and SOS.

Several weeks passed by until finally he received a highly encouraging letter of response from Linda conveying her belief that "such a book has merit and the University of South Carolina Press would indeed be interested in publishing such a book." She provided a list with the names of five potential co-writers who could fit the bill. He struck through the names of those geographically located outside the Columbia Metropolitan Area where he lives and those with stuffy, stiff-shirt sounding names, a few of which took a mouthful of syllables to pronounce. He wanted a regular old "Tom" who would

understand him and be genuinely enthusiastic about the book's unique subject matter. The story was yet to be written, and attitude means everything in capturing it into words carefully assembled and plucked with the right tone. Through the process of careful elimination, or shall I say with a "feel good" stroke of blind faith, he penciled in a checkmark by the only remaining name left, "Tom Pollard, A Southern Writer," and proclaimed, "That's gotta be my man." This was a homerun through and through; a grand slam which is evident with the final manuscript. Having Tom was a true blessing which seemed to help everything fall right into place as though predestined by fate.

Now the plow was hooked up to the mule and ready for plowing. Their first order of business was to put forth a formal book proposal to the USC Press outlining, among other things, an analysis of market potential, a synopsis along with several completed chapters, biographical information about the authors, and representative photography. An impressive proposal, seemingly immune to any naysayers, was crafted, submitted and accepted. Now the USC Press held the reins; they would call out the "git ups" and "gee haws" for guidance. Many hours of research and brainstorming lay ahead. Dr. Phil and Tom were alike in many ways, yet opposite in many others, but when it came down to work they would congeal as one.

A seed of mutual respect one another quickly germinated and they bonded as skilled collaborators each bringing to the table his own brand of raw talent harnessed with a collar of vast experience. A critical path toward successful completion of the project was identified, agreed upon and embarked on. Tom, an outsider to both the shag world and SOS, would quickly become just as, if not more, informed than most insiders. Together they presented the "who, what, when, where and why's," and carefully ponder the "how's," until finally, as the USC Press describes it, "...the story about a unique dance and its cultural spread throughout the South..." took shape. And the shape it took was purposely unique and different from any other predecessor book published about the shag.

The book would be tagged with the title, "Save the Last Dance for Me," and not only would it explore how the dance took root, it would also document how, with formal organization through local shag clubs, the Association of Carolina Shag Clubs and the Society of Stranders, it withstood changing times and prospered. Who would have thought a chance meeting held over a few cold beers in the kitchen of the Pine Island Club on Lake Murray while attending the 2nd Annual Columbia Invitational would spring into the Association of Carolina Shag Clubs now one hundred local shag clubs strong; or a former lifeguard could weld the impresario skills to organize a reunion of old beach bums which would cast its spell on dancers across the nation enticing them to migrate to the largest known adult party pitched this side of the Milky Way, and eventually form the inexorable Society of Stranders now fourteen thousand members strong.

Jazz drummer, the late Art Blakely, liked to say, "Jazz washes away the dust of everyday life." Shaggers certainly can also say the same about their beloved dance which sprouted from the same roots as jazz. This book explores the logical extension of the shag evolving out the same melting pot of cultural exchanges as jazz. Jazz age off-springs such as rhythm and blues set the backdrop for development of its steps. It now has become a true American pastime that not only entertains us but in many ways defines who we are. Everyday life is not always brain surgery and calculus exams. Leisurely expressions bring on smiles and laughter. They show us how to cope with overwhelming stress often at odds with our mental and physical well-being. Gradually, they transform into passionate pastimes that do indeed help us wash away the dust of everyday life. The shag and SOS are capacious lifelines for many, encompassing far more than just a dance. Their story reaches out, grabs us by the hand and invites us onto the dance floor of a lifestyle quite like no other. It is best summed up in the words of Dr. Phil, "S.O.S. will continue for years to come. Thousands of 'yet to be' shaggers and stranders will come to love this event just as much as many of you, who weren't around in the early 40s, or people like me who were never a life guard or a 'beach bum' in the late 40s or early 50s, have come to love it. S.O.S. is the personification of a way of life for which "a cold beer on a warm night with a hot date, and no plans for tomorrow, says it all." Trust me, you will thoroughly enjoy reading about it in "Save the Last Dance for Me"—a book about us.

Since then, there hasn't been a single day that Tommy hasn't served as an officer, board member, committee chair, or committee member. He currently serves on our Governor's Board, which is an advisory group for our club. He and Gail are our "go to" members to fill any need.

Tommy was an early disciple of Shad Alberty, the true Master of the Dance, and as such was instrumental in bringing shag lessons to the Rock Hill Area. For several years, Tommy danced on the CSA/SPA circuit and won many contests. He was widely admired for his dedication to keeping the dance "pure" with the highest degree of smoothness, grace, and execution when elements of swing were beginning to infiltrate. He has been a great ambassador of shag within the greater ACSC/SOS community by frequently giving demonstrations and exhibitions for many clubs' events. For 13 years, Tommy and Gail taught a Junior Assembly class for ninth through twelfth graders with an average attendance of 300+ teens! Many of those teens are now adult members of our shag club. Today, he continues to share his knowledge and talent by teaching the young and old, talented and challenged, inspired and uninspired. At social events, he dances with whoever holds out a hand and makes his partner look and feel like a pro.

His love for the Carolina Shag fuels his dedication and support. He was co-creator of our Spring Fling, Winter Beach Blast, and the Hall of Fame Foundation Fundraiser. Rock Hill has a "Come-See-Me" spring festival, and Tommy is the ring leader of our club's participation in the event's Beach Bash Dance on the streets. He always shows up, hammer in hand, to work on putting shag club floats together for the Come-See-Me Parade, the Rock Hill Christmas Parade, and the SOS Spring Safari Parade. For all our events, he is there for the planning, there for the decorating and setting up, and there at the end to clean up.

When RHASC was debating about an organization to adopt as our charity of choice, Tommy and Gail campaigned successfully for the selection of the Hall of Fame Foundation. They always fill requests for dance demonstrations at retirement homes, church functions,



birthday parties, city sponsored events, and numerous charitable organizations' fund raisers.

Tommy Davis is an integral member of those visionaries who chartered a course that developed into a culture, which thousands of shaggers in the Rock Hill Area and the South enjoy today. Vickie Hyde

First Coast Shag Club

Since 1995 when Vickie became a member of First Coast Shag Club, she has been supportive and donated many hours of her time and talent to the success of the club. She uses creative ways to keep members involved as well as on the dance floor. When she sees someone not dancing, she makes it her mission to determine if it is by choice or to see if she can get them on the floor. She believes in laughter and in good feelings and that shagging is good for the soul. She readily shares her belief that people in the shag club aren't just friends; they are an extended family.

Because of her strong leadership abilities, any task given to Vickie—no matter how big or how small—will be completed successfully. She has served as vice-president, president, past president, and several terms as a board member. She has served on, chaired, or co-chaired many committees.

As Social Chairperson for 6 years, she organized and decorated for club parties and worked with members to put together themes and skits, which she choreographed to make parties fun and to encourage active participation by club members.

For over 5 years, she volunteered to video club events and workshops and with assistance from her husband, put them on tape to share with the club. They also assisted in getting the newsletter in the mail before electronic delivery became a common practice. She laminated the club's membership cards each year. She videotaped, copied, and distributed over 140 copies of DVDs of the 2010 Junior SOS Winter Jam. These copies went to ACSC shag clubs and subsidiaries to assist in promoting Junior SOS and to encourage attendance. Each year she videos portions of Junior SOS and sends the information to presidents to preserve in their archives.

Vickie actively participates in Junior SOS and assists with teaching workshops. She serves as the Florida representative for the Ellen Taylor Foundation for Juniors and collects shoes from shag club members throughout the state. She hosted a "graduation" party with certificates for the first class of Junior Shaggers in Jacksonville. She donated her time and taught two juniors to shag. Both

placed first in the 2010 Junior SOS Jack & Jill amateur Division Competition and second in CSA Junior I Division. Her female student placed 5th at the Grand Nationals in 2011 in Junior I division with another partner.

Teaching shag is her love. For many years she volunteered to teach adults and juniors at a local dance club in an effort to increase membership for FCSC. She volunteered and taught dancing to a class of developmentally disabled Jacksonville public school children so they could perform at the school's PTA event. This was the first time developmentally disabled children had been included in the PTA program in the 28 year history of the school. For several years, she volunteered to travel to Daytona Beach to promote shag and help build a shag club. She coached two local club shaggers for participation in SPA and CSA contests. For non CSA events, Vickie has served as a dance contest judge for clubs in Georgia and South Carolina. For the past 2 years, she chaired the very successful Jack & Jill Dance Off for FCSC, which included organizing, selecting judges and trophies, and encouraging participation.

For 3 years, Vickie was one of the FCSC dance team "Pivoteers" and assisted with choreographing the routines. She participated in making three shag instructional DVDs for FCSC, and she assisted with developing the shag instruction curriculum for the club instructors.

In 2009, Vickie co-chaired the Thursday night riverboat kickoff party for the FCSC/ ACSC Summer Workshop. The kick-off party received rave reviews. She will again serve on this committee for the 2012 FCSC/ ACSC Summer Workshop as well as chair the dance instructor committee.

In recognition of her productive involvement in promoting shag and preserving it for many generations to come, she was inducted into the Virginia Living Legends of Dance in 2007, and inducted into the Florida Shaggers Hall of Fame in 2009. She will represent the Icon Award with pride and honor.

Camden Lugoff Area Shag Society

Terry has filled many shoes in our club and in the shag world for the past 19 years. He has coordinated many functions, taught shag lessons with Kathy at the Fine Arts Center, planned many parties benefiting both the Camden Shrine Club and the Camden Lugoff Area Shag Society (CLASS), kept our club up to date with SOS information and with ACSC information by attending the business meetings and the spring and winter workshops. Three years ago, he arranged a free weekend trip to Ocean Drive during DJ Throwdown for our members who were



not familiar with the center of the shag universe and to introduce them to the heartbeat of the shag world.

During the past 4 years, Terry has served as an incredibly active and effective president of our club by introducing many new programs designed to increase both shagging's presence within the local community and our club's presence within the shag world. Charles Henderson Gurley - A Life and Lifelong Friend, Remembered

As the famous philosopher, singer and songwriter Jimmy Liggins once said "It ain't eight-to-the-bar that I got my fame, I'm you boogie woogie king". Well, Charles Gurley was truly the boogie woogie king for many of us. Nobody I've ever known has loved it any better, did it any better, or left it in better hands than he has. He has left a legacy in music and dance that will live on in all those who were fortunate enough to have had him as a friend, teacher and mentor in dance and music. Charles left us on April 21, 2011 after an illness left him in a wheelchair since February of 2002, and his influence will last as long as the music and dance we love exists.



Charles loved Atlantic Beach because when he was young that's where he went to see the best dancers in North Carolina. He so enjoyed going to Atlantic Beach Hall of Fame and was in the group first inducted, a tribute to how they felt about him. He loved Williams Lake near Dunn, where he used to dance in an old lake house out over the water and hear the great old groups that used to play there. In the recent years Robert Honeycutt who used to run it revived Williams Lake by having a reunion in Clinton, N.C. and Charles really loved rekindling that relationship and seeing old friends who went there.

It's hard for me to remember not having him as a part of my life. I know it happened, but he was so influential in it that it seems as if he has always been there. Charles was a remarkable man in so many ways and was what I would consider a modern Renaissance Man. He loved music, dance, art, antiques, and specialized in art glass and American furniture, loved history, the Civil War, opera, especially Pavarotti, and had a fabulous knowledge of it all. For all of you that knew Charles and hung around him, I don't have to tell you about his knowledge of music. He could recall a record hardly anyone ever heard of, the label and color of it, the number of the record, who was singing it and the lead singer, what they did before that record, what they did after that record, and the names and members the group had later. I, and a lot of us, would sit there and listen and marvel at his knowledge and recall. He had a magnificent memory and could remember things that astounded me and a lot of others about songs, records, and groups. He could listen to a Doo Wop song and tell you where the group was from just by the harmony and the way the lead singer sang the song. That my friends is when you are the authority, and as Jim Davis, another great music authority, said to me, we will never see the likes of a musical encyclopedia like that again. Charles also prized memorabilia and the walls throughout his home and in his music room are covered with posters and pictures that bring back the memories that remind him of years gone by when it was so much fun to be young and times were so much more innocent and genuine and fresh.

Charles Gurley loved a club and a beer joint and I am not sure many folks have been in many more that he has. He just loved to walk in and smell the joint, get a feel for it, and hit the bar and the dance floor.

He loved the old Reds in Raleigh because of Gary Gibson playing music there. He loved Loafers because it was Gary's club. He loved Ducks and Ducks Too, because Norfleet said at the top I got to deal with tourists, but the bottom is yours and you guys can hear what you want. Well, we did and we had some of the best times ever there. He loved The Pavilion at Ocean Drive because it reminded him when he was young and at Atlantic Beach at that Pavilion, when times were simpler, more innocent and we all felt invincible. He would say "son, I can't wait to get over there with that breeze blowing and the music playing, and the whiskey and all the boys- that's what it's all about".

And then there was "The Nest" at Sea Villas III on Ocean Boulevard, Charles' and Kathy's condo at the beach, so named because all the boys and girls would flock there when he was in town. I believe that it was either Kim Maynard or Carl Smith who may have named it because one of them said one time "Damn Charles, everybody is flocking in here like birds to a nest". Not positive about that, and Kathy can probably tell you about that better than I. We had some of the best times of our lives there and did so many others. It was a hideaway for kids wanting to learn how to dance, hear the music and sometimes learn to partake of a light beverage, it was party headquarters for our entire crowd, it was the gathering place when we were going to a joint, and it was a haven for those who loved our music, dancing and lifestyle. And he was the proud papa, standing in the corner and surveying all who were there. He was proud of the fact that everyone felt so comfortable there, and he and Kathy truly enjoyed it when everyone gathered at the Nest. You know it is a special place when you hear someone say at another beer joint "are you going to the Nest today? I hear they are playing A and B music and there's a party", and you don't even know those people.

I could regale you with a number of stories from the Nest but probably should not. Like when we first met Mike and Billie Roseman and they would walk in, take the caps off two bottles of whiskey and throw them in the trash. Or when he would always get Steve Dean up in the morning with a cold Budweiser on his chest- Charles said it was better than an alarm clock. Or when we all would get in at 2-3 AM and would stay up singing Doo Wop all night and finally get to bed and he would be up an hour or two later waking us up saying "son, we got to go to the flea market and hunt records." Or when Carl Smith would come in and bring a case of beer and tell him "son, I don't plan on being here too long so I only brought a few." Or when Sam McIntosh came over on Sunday mornings and got Charles up knowing we had to go home, only we never left, and we all got snickered by 10 and we were at the club by 1. Or when the young boys would be waiting by the door for us to either get up or come home so they could come in and play with Charles. They knew the Charles Gurley school of boogie woogie was about to be in session.

and it was going to be fun. Or when Grayson Smith showed up one morning and Charles asked him "son, did you have a good time?" He said, "Well, I can't find my car, lost my socks, shoes and underwear". Charles said, "son, get him some clothes and go help him find his car. Looks like you had a big time to me". Or when Charles and Kathy Jane would get to the nest for the weekend and within 30 minutes it would be packed. He had that effect on people; they just wanted to be around him. Charles always met people with a smile and had a greeting "son, how are ya?" and just through osmosis I have used that greeting for years. He knew no strangers and if they were, they left as friends. He influenced so many people so positively that it would be hard to name them all, and if I tried, some would be left out who shouldn't be. He also influenced a lot of female dancers and they always liked dancing with him because he danced to great music and loved to boogie, and he let them work out and show their stuff.

I could not talk about him without talking about Kathy Jane, his wife. She has looked after drunks, ne'er-do-wells and knuckleheads longer and more times than anyone I know, and I know this because Charles and I seemed to be there for them all. I don't know of a woman who has put up with more, from more drunks, more times, in so many places as she has. Honest to God, if she had not been a saint, she could not have done it. She has been by his side during the last nine years like no one I have ever seen. He told me countless times how much he loved her and how lucky he was to have her, and I would always say, I know. She is one in a billion.

We have all heard and said that life is short. In times like this as we get older and a lot of our heroes and friends leave us, we know it all too well. While Charles has left us, he continues to inspire me every day to be a better man, to be tougher, to be stronger, to be more loving, to be kinder, to be more compassionate and to enjoy each day you have. He does this because I have seen him live and endure and enjoy life under the most unimaginable adversity a man can have when you have so much energy and love to dance and drink with friends and you no longer can. He often told me "son, I miss dancing, but I really miss taking a drink with all you boys". He faced his demons with the dignity, strength, and heart that I and many of us can only hope to have. He was the best friend any man could ever want. He was a joy and beacon in my life that has now dimmed, but I promise to never allow his name or legacy to die or to diminish as long as I live.

It has been said that no man is an island who has friends. By the life he led, the people he influenced, the friends he made and all those that love him, and the turn out at his service, Charles Gurley was a continent. I, and so many, loved him and will miss him forever. He is still and always will be the boogie woogie king. To summarize his life and our times together, I paraphrase Captain Augustus McCray to Captain Woodrow F. Call near the end of the movie Lonesome Dove as Gus lay dying, "Son, it's been quite a party, ain't it?"

My Music Or Yours

KHP Music has given us numerous compilations over the years, many of which were introduced at the Society of Stranders' Spring Safaris and Fall Migrations. Of all of the releases that really stood out, the new release, Stepping Out Tonight, introduced at DeeJay Throwdown, is surely to be marked as one of the best. Already, four of the songs grace Beach Music's Top 40 and 45 charts, and, surely, there is more to come. L.J. Reynolds is going strong with Come Get To This, moving rapidly up the charts and now in the Top Ten. This is the third time that this song has graced the Top Ten, originally by Marvin Gaye and just a few years ago by The Craig Woolard Band. L.J. Reynolds is no stranger to Beach Music. He was, and still is, lead singer of The Dramatics, who had hits with In The Rain and Be My Girl. The Detroit native left the group to resume a solo career, giving us hit's like He Can't Love You and What's The Matter Baby. Another hot song that is a part of Stepping Out Tonight is I'm In Heaven When I'm With You by Roy Hamilton. This song is also rapidly moving upward. This Roy Hamilton is not to be confused as related to the late, great Roy Hamilton who gave us The Clock, Don't Let Go and many, many other songs. The Roy Hamilton I am writing about is from England. The release also contains the hit song, From The Back by L.J. Echols. This one reminds me a lot of the material released by The Hardway Connection. L.J. Echols grew up in the small town of Bassfield, Mississippi. Like so many Rhythm & Blues artists, L.J. Started out in his family Gospel group, The Echols family. In 1999, he moved to Dallas, Texas and started his own musical career. In 2008, he released his second album which contains his hit From The Back. Also gracing the Top 45 is I'm Crazy 'Bout The Woman In Red by Atlantic Groove. The KHP compilation also features Step On By by Winzell Kelly. Like, L.J. Reynolds, Winzell spent many years, nearly twenty, with the legendary Dramatics, and still performs with the current line-up along with L.J. Reynolds. The Detroit native began playing both bass and saxophone as a teenager. Stepping Out Tonight also carries Come On by The Sons Of Saint Rocco, which is a part of the Sons' latest project, Take 2. The Sons of Saint Rocco is Phil Granito, a very talented multi-instrumented individual. Also joining in on the compilation is Kingdaddy, hailing from the parts of Western South Carolina and Eastern North Carolina. The relatively newcomer band gives us an original, She's The One For Me, with tight harmonies, electrifying horns and a seamless rhythm



section. The music doesn't stop here. Stepping carries a new one from Jim Quick, All That Matters, a new one from Bo Schronce and The Fantastic Shakers, I Don't Like To Sleep Alone and Second Chance by The Carolina Breakers. The compilation also features The Breeze Band with Being With You, Legacy with Ain't That The Way and Old Friends by Phil Wilson and Jackie Gore. Stepping Out Tonight is no doubt one of the better compilations that KHP Music has ever released.

Rhonda McDaniel has given us numerous hits over the years. As a result, among her numerous awards for songs and albums, the talented upstate singing sensation has won the Carolina Beach Music Awards' Female Vocalist of the Year award 4 years running. Her hits, Lighten Up and Touching In The Dark prompted the voters to select her as the 2011 Female Vocalist of the Year at the 2011 CBMA Awards held in November at the Alabama Theater in North Myrtle Beach, South Carolina. Rhonda now has released her latest, Where The Boys Are, on the KHP label. Rhonda's Where The Boys Are is a remake of the 1960 hit by Connie Frances. The number was the title song of the movie by the same name, filmed in Fort Lauderdale, Florida about college students on Spring Break in the sixties. The movie has always been one of my favorites, and so has the song. Look for Rhonda's version to be played often during the key song of Rhonda's release, in my opinion, is Look Before You Leap. This one is a remake of a Marcia Ball number. Look for it to make quite a splash during the Spring Safari. Rhonda also sings Sneakin' Around. Rhonda's rendition of this song is not to be confused with Tommy Black's Sneakin' Around. This version was originally done by famed New York Jazz singer, Veronica Martell. The new release also features more new material, including, Power In The Music, Teardrops From My Eyes, We're Tight, Look Me In The Heart, I Can't Get You Off Of My Mind and another ballad, Be Serious. The album also features some of Rhonda's previously recorded songs, the hits Lighten Up, Touching In The Dark and the duet with Mike Taylor of The Holiday Band, You Bug Me Baby. Also included is We're Tight from KHP's Ready To Party compilation. The McCormick, South Carolina resident has been singing since she could talk. She joined her first band, Southern Comfort, at age thirteen. In 1991, she joined Brasstown Ball, now know as BrassTyme, as vocalist and keyboard player. She was with the group for over eighteen years.

Steve Owens and Summertime has released the group's



debut self-titled album. With the most diverse repertoire the group is sure to be a crowd please. Steve Owens and Summertime is made up of seven of the finest vocalists and musicians in the Southeast. Each member of the band has played with some of the top bands over the years and have come together to provide top-notch performances. Steve Owens And Summertime carries three of the group's previously released songs, the popular Greatest Love Ever Known, which was featured on Tobacco Road Record Carolina Soul Collection and A Much Better Place, which was featured on Tobacco Road Take A Little Ocean Drive compilation. The album also features I'd Give Up Everything. Among the covers included on the album are Beach Music favorites I Dig Everything About You. Previously released by The Mob and You're So Young But You're So True by The Lost Generation. Other covers include 38 Special's Second Chance, Tower of Power's Recapture The Music, Luther Vandross' Dance



With My Father and Vince Gill's uptempo Workin' On A Big Chill. Be sure and check out Steve Owens And Summertime, from KHP Records. Prior to forming the band, Steve sang with several groups over the years including sharing lead vocals with Karen Clayton for The Castaways. You will be hearing a lot from Steve Owens and Summertime in the future. The music is always heard with this Roanoke Rapids, North Carolina band.

Gary Lowder has released his latest, just in time for the Spring Safari. The title of the CD is Coastin' and is being released by KHP Records. Coastin' has already caught on along the coast of the Carolinas and is doing well in inland clubs. Another song that should do well after Coastin' plays out is Never Never. In fact, even though I like Coastin' a lot, I like Never Never slightly better. Another number you might want to check out is The Love Came. The album all original material was written by Gary. Coastin' is one you don't want to miss out on. Gary Lowder is a native of China Grove, North Carolina. Work later took him to Minneapolis, Minnesota where he had spent eighteen years. One day while battling a snowstorm on the way



to work, Gary decided it was time for him to return home to the Carolinas. He has found success in coming home, developing his own solo career and singing with The Carolina Breakers and The Legends Of The Beach. Gary is married and has two grown children, both of whom live in Minneapolis and have provided him with three grandchildren.

The Fabulous Jelly Rolls began their road to fame in the spring of 1996, when Russ Riley, a.k.a. Blind Jelly Melon, Chigger Woods, Frank Brantley, Rommie Tyndall, Mike Tewell, Gene Pope, Larry Mangum and Scott Utley came together to perform at local clubs and events in and around Durham, North Carolina. On a cold afternoon in 1999, the group got together and recorded their first efforts, one of which was Bring Your Own Money, a tune written by Russ, Frank and Scott. First performed in 1999, the acceptance of the song from the crowds led them to record the number for Ripete Records for the compilation, Life's A Beach Volume 2. Over the years, the Jellyrolls recorded ten more songs as a part of various compilations. Fast forwarding the clock fifteen years, The Jelly Rolls introduce their first full album, Blind Jelly Melon And The Fabulous Jellyrolls...From The Beginning. The album includes all of their previously recorded material, including the previously unreleased song from the first recording session, Don't Make Me Beg. The album features a typical Jellyroll-type song, You Never Had It So Good. Scottie Utley, who sings with the group from time to time, shares the lead vocals with Russ Riley. Russ Riley along with Frank Brantley wrote many of the early songs with Russ writing all the new ones. Another one to pay close attention to is Mini-Foo-Foo, which has a "Blues Brothers" flavor to it. Other new songs included Little Things, a slow one with a country flavor, a Gospel number, Leavin' It Up To You and the comical song, Red Neck In A Beach Music Band. Durwood Martin formally of The Embers plays the piano for all of the new songs. Of the other previously recorded numbers, From The Beginning carries Don't Get Between A Dog And His Meat from the 2001 album, A Tribute To Fat Harold, Like The Rain from 2003's Beach Party 2, a shagger's favorite, Rita Mae with Gary Bass and The Jellyrolls from 2005's If Tens Gonna Kill Me Give Me Nine, Lie To Me from 2006's Locals Only 2, Suffer With The Blues, written and lead vocals by Scott Utley, from 2007's Forever Summer, Red Shagging Shoes from the album Get Ready For Showtime and I Wanna Win from Tobacco Road's Carolina Soul Collection. Also on the album is the Jellyroll's recording of Rudolph The Red Nose Reindeer from KHP's Ocean Drive Christmas Volume 2, recorded in 2007 and Rock This House from the Old School Shag album, recorded in 2008. Blind Jelly Melon And The Fabulous Jellyrolls From The Beginning was produced under the direction of Chigger Woods, Frank Brantley and Russ Riley with special assistance from Julian Fowler and Chris Jennings, guitarist for The Fantastic Shakers. The album was mixed, mastered and edited by Keith Houston of KHP Music.

"TOMATO SANDWICHES in the Shower"

The author moved to Ocean Drive in the Spring of 1990 and works on Main Street. She is writing a series of stories for her daughter, Taffy, one of which is . . . "Tomato Sandwiches in the Shower"

I'm so fortunate to be able to say that I've spent time every summer of my life in Ocean Drive. My parents met in Myrtle Beach in 1939 outside Spivey's Pavilion. After settling in Albemarle, N.C., they always spent our summer vacations at Ocean Drive Beach. How lucky I was, and since 1990, I've made it my home.

I learned to dance when I was about fourteen, and once the sand was in my shoes, there was no turning back. It was then that I can first remember going without my parents to where the jukebox played and the people danced. They never said so, but you could sense that you had to be more "grown-up" to be in there. Before, all my time was spent riding the rides, but something had changed... ..I had changed..... those rides were suddenly for children. We could come to the beach and hear music that we didn't hear at home. The

beach was nothing like home and yet became a part of what we wanted to call home. Those memories are why we come back.

The ocean breeze in your hair and the thought of doing a dance step that someone would want to watch you do, with a hunk of a boy that wanted to hold your hand and dance with you, was injected into my veins like a drug, putting me in a place that I never wanted to leave. Just give me the beach and a dance floor and I was happy!

My sixteenth summer I took a friend, Lana Hinson, to the beach with us. Like most cottages, our second row, two story beach house had front screened porches, to either sleep on, rock on, or just get the great breezes. I could count on my Father having his "Happy Hour" each day on the porch and since we didn't have any televisions, the music from a small radio provided all that he needed for a quick nap. Beach houses then had a small stoop at the back door that led to the back yard, clothes lines for wet clothes, and a large two-stall enclosed, wooden outside shower. Everyone used them to wash the sand from your body and bathing suits before coming inside. They weren't much bigger than the closets in the bedrooms inside. The doors, walls and floors were wooden slats to allow the air in, yet give you enough privacy and the floor allowed the water to drain into the sand. Remember,those sheets and towels had to last all week.....no washing machines like home; and sand in either of them was not a good thing! To me, even though the cottages had very little of the conveniences of home, they were so different that we all can remember what they looked like; usually 2 bedrooms on each side and an open Living/Dining/Kitchen in the center. The 2 bathrooms were between each set of bedrooms. Closets were almost non-existent, but

all we really needed was a bathing suit, shorts, a halter top and sandals and we were good to go. For those of us lucky enough to have been here during that time, we all have a house in our memories that fits this picture. Don't we?

While dancing at O.D., we met two boys from Hickory, N.C. They told us they were out of money and didn't have a place to stay and would start "thumbing" home soon, even though it was night and we all knew it was unlikely anyone would pick them up. We told them where our cottage was and to "go to the shower behind the house". They would have a place to spend the night and we would sneak them some food. I wasn't allowed to date yet, so bringing them home was not an option. We made tomato sandwiches (Sunbeam white bread, Kraft Miracle Whip salad dressing, salt, pepper and our home-grown tomatoes) wrapped them in waxed paper and took them to the boys in the shower. They spent the night there and left before anyone got up the next morning.

I wonder how many times THEY told this story?

Enjoy some pictures of those houses that are still around. I hope they stir those memories for you.

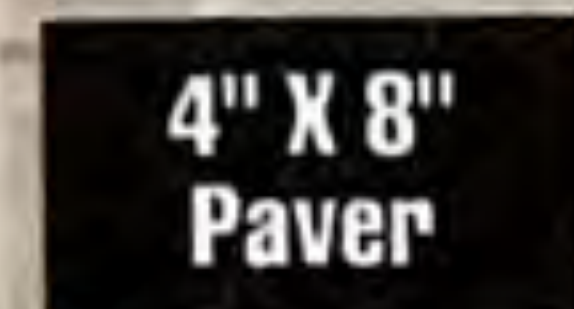

THREADS OF MEMORIES REVISITED

The beauty of art never ceases to feed our intellect. It is sustenance that lifts us far above our everyday struggles just to survive. Art not only takes on many different aesthetic forms and contents which create tangible shapes, colors and textures, it also exhibits intangible executions that invoke meaning into what each artist wishes to portray through his or her work. How art continues to find uniqueness in a modern world that has seen and done just about everything under the sun is nothing short of amazing. The abundance of creativity continues to find our imagination and spellbound us with endless wonder and appreciation at what the human mind can conjure up. It speaks to us in a way that attracts our creative urges and lets them loose on our intellect. Art is bound by no rules, and interpretations of it, even by unsophisticated senses like mine, stay gentle on the minds of those who appreciate it for eternity. It is meant to be shared and never forgotten. It is a stamped postcard of life as it is, as it was, and as it can be.

In 2006 a very special piece of artwork that had been in the making for nearly two years came our way. Its unveiling stole the hearts of those who had the good fortune of seeing it firsthand. It took on a highly unique form and content carefully designed and stitched into a magnificent quilt that tells the story of an era from the early 1980's through 2004 in which our beloved dance, its music and its people began to flourish and merge into a formidable "shag" subculture. I know you're scratching your head and wondering how a quilt can tell a story. The answer is not only quite simple but highly ingenious. It was designed and sewn together by the late Beverly Cone from tee shirts that had been collected over a span nearly three decades by Ellen Taylor. Many of you may know of or have read about Hall-of-Fame shag dance instructor, Ellen Taylor, and her dedication to promoting the shag dance among our junior shaggers. Those of you who do know of Ellen also know that she has been around the block a time or two.

With her incredible stamina and enthusiasm, I would venture to guess that Ellen Taylor could probably go on record as having attended as many, if not more, shag dance events than anyone else. Along the way she has collected commemorative tee shirts for each of those events that offered them.

Many of these tee shirts were rare keepsakes. Ellen described just a few of them in an article she wrote for the 2006 Carefree Times entitled "Threads of Memories," "There was a one of a kind shirt with a picture of Richard Nixon, the KING of disc jockeys and a dear friend who died in the 80's and much too soon; a one of a kind shirt with the words inscribed 'Dance at the PAD cause YO Mama did.' Many of you will remember Mit Starbuck, another friend who died too soon. Mit was responsible for an event called 'The Grand Party' which took place in the early 80's and was one of the first big parties during that time other than SOS..." Ellen was on the verge of getting rid of these tee shirts to make room for new clothing, but when pulling them out of storage she found that she simply could not part with a single tee shirt. Two of Ellen's friends



Jan Hutchins and Tim Miller, who were visiting from West Virginia suggested that she talk with friend and fellow shagger, Beverly Cone, who was an extremely gifted quilter, about the possibility of designing a quilt using Ellen's collection of rare tee shirts. Ellen's vision of such a quilt "would be a walk through time from the past to present." Her work with junior shaggers impelled her to make plans to auction the quilt when completed and use the proceeds to benefit junior shaggers during their quest to learn and perfect the dance. This thought was the seed that sprouted roots for the Ellen Taylor Foundation for Junior Shaggers.

Beverly Cone was a shagger from way back when. She has a grandson who had just gotten his feet wet as a junior shagger attending his second Junior SOS during 2006. Consequently, she was

very sympathetic to the cause and would not hear of accepting compensation for her efforts. Beverly welcomed the challenge to design and construct the quilt with open arms. It would hold special meaning to her just as it would with Ellen. You could see the pride taken with every stitch when it was first unveiled to the public during the 2006 SOS Spring Safari. This is truly a special piece of artwork that belongs to the ages.

The logistics of auctioning the quilt never quite fell into place. Ellen described the anticipated feeling of giving up the quilt to the highest bidder in her 2006 Carefree Times article, "For Beverly and me, it is like giving birth to a child and then giving it up for adoption. It is our dream that the person who becomes the owner will treasure it as we do and perhaps someday, if there is a shag museum, will place it in a shadow box for everyone to enjoy." Such a wish cannot be guaranteed, and as each day passes, the beauty of the quilt cries out for public viewing, not only by shaggers but non-shaggers as well—the beauty is just as appealing to those with no inside knowledge of the events captured on the embedded tee shirts. Ellen and Beverly elected to hold on to the quilt until an appropriate venue for public display would present itself. Shag dance museums are few and far between.

Finally, over the past couple of years plans began shaping up to construct the North Myrtle Beach Area Historical Museum (NMBAHM). Among the many genres of exhibits in the works, the museum plans to set aside an area dedicated solely to the "The Shag Dance," our state dance for which North Myrtle Beach is well known to be home to. These plans are now concrete and ground breaking with brick and mortar are currently underway. It will be located at 799 2nd Avenue in the City of North Myrtle Beach off Highway 17 just a couple of blocks south of Main Street. The Ellen Taylor Foundation for Junior Shaggers has offered this quilt to the museum and they have graciously accepted it. It's been a long time coming but well worth the wait because this museum will be the perfect home for this magnificent quilt. It will rightfully be displayed alongside many other historical and cultural artifacts that will catch visitors' eyes and cause them to stop, read their story, and comprehend their meaning.



Beverly Cone died this past January. She was thrilled to learn over the Christmas holidays that her artistry will be on public display in the North Myrtle Beach Area Historical Museum for visitors to admire and cherish for years to come. It is one of many thumbprint legacies she left behind that gives us a

glimpse into the special talent she possessed. The quilt is aptly named, "Threads of Memories."



Another Good One Is Gone

Well, us Shaggers have lost another good one. Bobby Griffin has left us. Heaven is getting some good dancers lately.

I can remember seeing Bobby and his big sister Suzy lighting up the floor in The Pavilion at Atlantic Beach back in the 1950's. Fortunately, I got to know Bobby and his lovely wife Kate as we got older. He never stopped loving this dance and the people that came with it. Besides being a real good dancer Bobby Griffin was one of the nicest, sweetest guys I ever met. Bobby was a good father, a good husband, and a good grand daddy. There was not much about Bobby that you couldn't like. He liked horses and he loved people. He loved his family. In all of the years I knew Bobby Griffin, I never heard him say a bad word about another person. We can always use someone like that.
